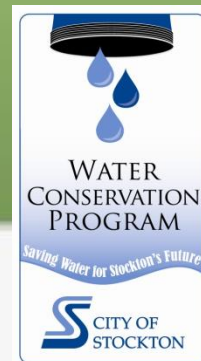

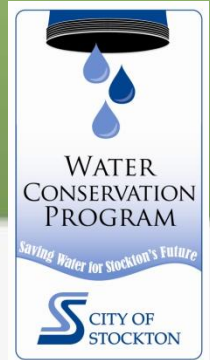

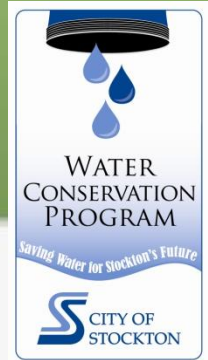
Program Overview



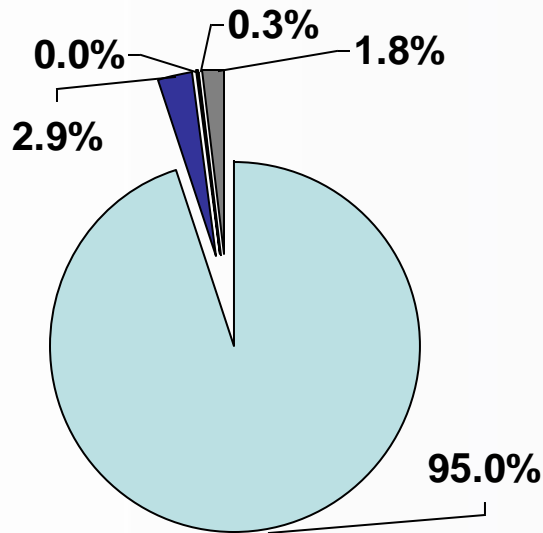
- Program Kick-off
 - March 1, 2010
- No-cost direct install of water efficient toilets for CII customers (must be City water utility customer)
- \$150,000 allocated to program
- Program may replace up to 500 toilets- approximate savings of 470-500 acre-feet



Why CII Customers?

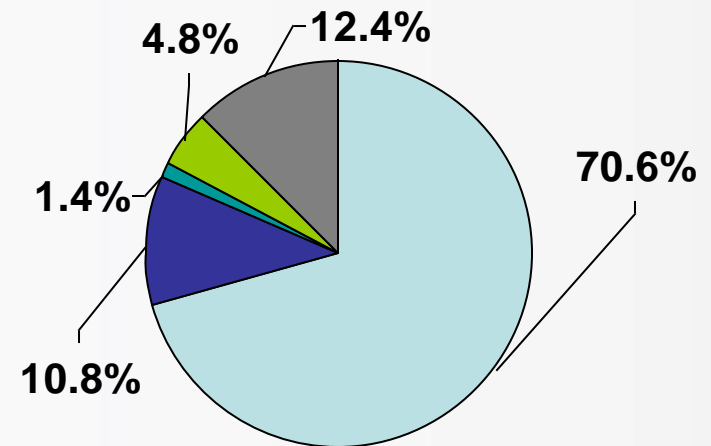


Customer Type

■ Institutional ■ Landscape

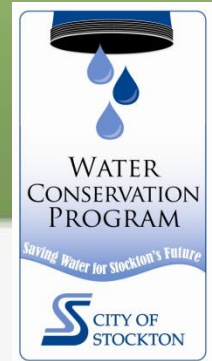
Consumption

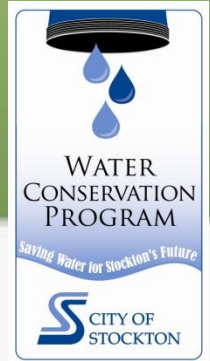
Benefits of Installing High Efficiency Toilets



- High Efficiency Toilet Direct Install Program will cover installation and hardware cost for toilets
- Toilets installed will use 1.28 gallons per flush- approximate water savings of 3.75 gallons per flush
- Plumbing contractor to review other bathroom water use fixtures
- Reduced water use = Reduced water bills



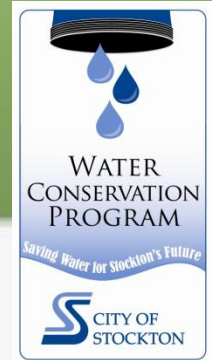
Benefits to the City of Stockton



- Cost benefit of saving water
 - Program cost of \$325 per acre foot
 - City pays \$350+ per acre foot for water
- Assists City in meeting water conservation goals
 - California Urban Water Conservation Best Management Practices
 - Urban Water Management Plan
 - Demand Management Measures
 - Comprehensive Water Package
 - November 2009
 - Senate Bill No. 7
 - 20x2020



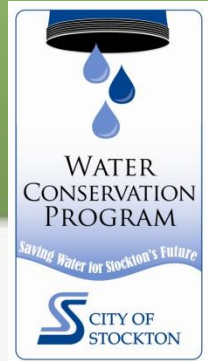
Eligibility and Participation



- Customers
 - City of Stockton Water Service Area
 - Commercial, Industrial or Institutional
 - Customer responsible for selecting plumbing contractor and scheduling
 - Customer responsible for providing Permission & Release Form
- Plumbing Contractors
 - Local plumber
 - Agree to Standards of Service and additional criteria
- Qualifying Toilets
 - HET 1.28 gpf WaterSense labeled



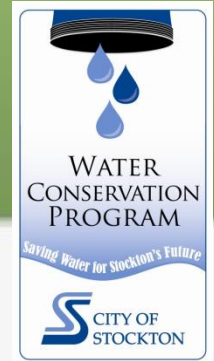
Program Limitations



- First-come, First-served basis
- Replacement of toilets > 1.6 gpf
- Not applicable for remodels
- Unit limitations
 - 25 units per service address
 - 50 units per property owner
 - Must submit permission and release form
 - City to verify customer status prior to authorizing work



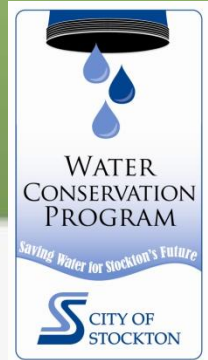
Additional Water Conservation Measures in the Workplace
